November 10, 2009, Regular Meeting

- Lee Loomis reminded us of the SunKing Recycling project to refurbish 20 televisions to be donated to Grace Urban Ministries and some extra computers to be donated to the literacy project at Industry. We need at least four Rotarians on Saturday, November 21st for approximately four hours to complete this project. Meet at 8:00AM for breakfast at McDonald's in Spencerport and then on to Brockport to SunKing Recycling.
- Richard Nereau reported that the School 33 Principal's Book of the Month Club now has \$1400 designated for that project. In addition, the Industry volunteers are working hard and enjoying it. The evening section of this project will begin within the next week. The staff at Industry are delighted with the scope and enthusiasm of this project. President JJ recommends we write this project up to be submitted for the District awards.
- President JJ asked for someone to take minutes of our meetings during the three month absence of Secretary, Diana Balch. Cindy Howe volunteered to take this on. Diana will continue to submit the attendance report to the District with the help of Sgt of Arms, Dave Reeves.
- President JJ also asked for volunteers and/or suggestions for the next President-Elect. This slot should be filled in December. Asking everyone to give it careful consideration.
- Lee Loomis introduced Doug Parker from Sage Ruddy as our program speaker. The topic, "To Forgive is Human, but not in the Vocabulary of the IRS." The program was interesting and informative. Doug emphasized the top five things we should know:
 - Be sure to make your required minimum distribution when you turn 70-1/2
 - Review your beneficiary statements annually
 - Spend the money ... manage the cashflow and penalties
 - Carefully monitor IRA transfers (and retirement plan rollovers)
 - Be sure investments support your distribution plan



Our program speaker at our next meeting, November 24th, will be representatives from Grace's Table, the Scottsville Food Cupboard located at Grace Episcopal Church.

We are asking each member of our club to bring in food donations to our next meeting to give this food cupboard a boost and then continue with donations throughout the year.
